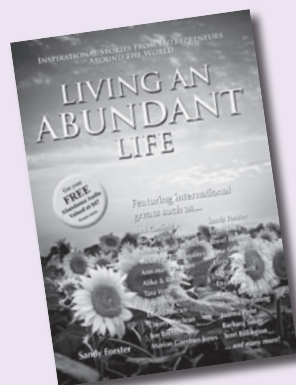

PROFILES *in* HOLINESS

St. John Gabriel Perboyne

1802-1840

I was born in southern France, January 6, 1802. My parents lived with a sincere faith based on their belief in all of the truths taught by the Catholic Church without exception. They never settled in their pursuit of perfection and they taught me and my seven siblings to give ourselves completely to God and to His will for our lives. They fostered a beautiful family environment and showed us how to live lives of authentic love based on truth and goodness.

When I was a teenager, my younger brother Louis heard God calling him to enter into the seminary. I agreed to accompany him for a short time in order to help him to get adjusted to the surroundings. While I was there, I was astonished to hear God speaking to me in the deepest part of my being. He instructed me to stay and enter into the seminary with Louis. God revealed the ideal of the priesthood to me and I understood it not as a feeble arrangement for life, but as the destiny of heroes. I entered the seminary.

My parents were surprised, but they offered me their complete encouragement. My paternal uncle Jacques was a missionary of St. Vincent. His witness had a big influence on me and all of my siblings. Five of us ended up hearing God's call and we all entered the Congregation of the Mission founded by St. Vincent de Paul in 1625. The charism attracted all of us; evangelization of the poor, formation of the clergy, but above all to push missionaries toward holiness.

I was ordained to the priesthood in 1826 and charged with the formation of seminarians. My consuming desire and most ardent prayer was that I might be allowed to labor in the foreign missions in China. For many years I begged this permission in vain.

Eventually, my brother Louis was sent to China. During the voyage, however, the young Louis, only 24 years of age, was called to heaven. I made the request to replace my brother in the breach and finally permission was granted.

I reached China in August of 1835. I studied the language and after five months, I was able, with some trouble, to express myself in proper Chinese. At once I threw myself into the ministry, visiting the small Christian communities.

I maintained an intense apostolate, but I suffered much in body and spirit. I wrote back to my homeland: "No, I am no more of a wonder man here in China than I was in France...ask of God first of all for my conversion and my sanctification and then the grace that I do not spoil His work too much..." I did not know at the time how God was working, but I trusted in Him, and I now know that He was preparing me for what was to come. His tools were the emptiness of humility and His own silence. He was strengthening me in faith, hope, and love.

In 1839, there was a renewed outbreak of persecution and I was betrayed into the hands of the authorities by one of my own neophytes for thirty pieces of silver. I was asked, "Are you a Catholic priest?" I replied, "Yes, I am a priest and I proclaim this religion." They asked, "Do you wish to renounce your faith?" I firmly responded, "No, I will never renounce the faith of Christ." I was asked to reveal my companions in the faith, but a witness to Christ is not an informer. Therefore, I remained silent.

I remember being held for many hours kneeling on rusty iron chains. I was then hung by my thumbs and hair from a rafter and beaten several times with bamboo canes. Greater than the physical violence, however, remained the wound of the fact that God's love was being put in ridicule: the hope in eternal life, the Sacraments, the Faith.

I was dragged from one tribunal to another, an object of bitter scorn and brutal mockery. I was beaten and scourged time after time. For not trampling on the crucifix, I received 110 strokes. My body became one great bleeding wound. I was confined in the fetid cells of a Chinese prison for almost a year. Although my body was weak, my soul was reinforced. Eventually I was condemned to be strangled on a cross; all this because I boldly confessed the Faith of Christ. My hope now rested in my meeting God, which I felt nearer each day. I told them for the last time: "I would sooner die than deny my faith!"

On September 11, 1840, with seven criminals, I was led up a height called the "Red Mountain." As the criminals were killed first, I reflected on my knees in prayer. When my turn came, black clouds hid the sun from sight. The executioners stripped me and tied me to a cross. The executioner coiled a heavy rope around my neck and twisted it slowly, slowly, tighter and tighter. I uttered my final words, "Into Thy hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit." Above in the darkened sky, a luminous cross became plainly visible to all present.



Nothing happens by chance. Neither life, nor death, nor vocation.

Know that I am here for you and that if you ask me, I will help you to give yourself completely to God and to His plan for your life. Keep going, especially when you encounter sufferings. Entrust yourself all the more to our crucified Savior. He knows what it is to suffer and He knows what it is to be raised to eternal life. Cling to Him always – as you suffer with Him, you will rise with Him.
